WUSA is a not-for-profit, member-driven organization that acts as the official voice of current undergraduate students at Waterloo. Where the University's primary goal is their global reputation, publishing research papers and academic roster; WUSA's at Waterloo.

We have 4 main approaches for achieving this goal:

- First, we structure the Board of Directors (made up of elected undergraduate students) as the guiding light for what we need to focus on as an organization. They take feedback from the student body and

 We bring power in numbers to discussions with the University administration, all three levels of government (local, provincial, federal) and any organization that affects student life at Waterloo. We tackle the root causes of issues students are facing to improve the Waterloo student experience for years to come.

Third, we provide services in three cases: when students demonstrate a necessity, when the University does not recognize it as a necessity or when there are perceived deficiencies in the university's resources to address it properly.






