## Systems Thinking

Understanding of how different parts of an organization or issue connect. A strong candidate will consider how changes in one area of student life might affect other areas.

## Research Assessment

Good candidates can sift through research, data, and student feedback to identify what's most important.

## Goal Prioritization

With so many competing interests and limited resources, candidates should have a clear vision for WUSA's future and the ability to focus on what is best for the organization.

## Understanding of Governance

Ability to ensure decisions are made transparently and with accountability within the set governance framework.

## Commitment to Student Advocacy

Passionate about representing student interests, amplifying your voice, and pushing for positive changes that enhance the student experience.
